<u>Le Passé Composé:</u> You use this to say some specific action happened in the past. (Examples: I <u>ate</u> a bar, we <u>watched</u> t.v., he <u>danced</u>, etc.)

How do you use it? -- You need 2 verbs...a "helper" verb plus another verb in the past form.

- The helper verb is usually some form of AVOIR.
- <u>ER</u> verbs end in "é", <u>IR</u> verbs end in "i", and <u>RE</u> verbs end in "u".

Examples: J'ai mangé, il a fini, nous avons attendu, etc.

For the negative, just put **NE** before the helper verb, and **PAS** after it (ne...pas sandwich).

Examples: Je n' <u>ai</u> pas mangé, Il n' <u>a</u> pas fini, etc.

Note! A FEW VERBS ARE WEIRD, AND HAVE THEIR OWN SPECIAL SPELLING IN THE PAST. THREE OF THESE ARE:

Voir (to see) – vu Être (to be) – été Avoir (to have) – eu

For example: J' ai **vu** Avatar. = I saw Avatar.

Vous avez **eu** un accident. = You had an accident.
